Re: Report of the May 4, 2026, Meeting of the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules and Regulations

With this report, the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules and Regulations (Committee) provides its comments on rules and regulations reviewed at its meeting on May 4, 2026. Agencies are asked to respond to each comment or request for information. Responses are compiled and maintained by staff of the Kansas Legislative Research Department.

Emergency Medical Services Board

KAR 109-2-6, types of ambulance services and staffing; KAR 109-2-7a, ground ambulance staffing; KAR 109-2-11, standards for air ambulances and equipment.

The Committee had no comments.

Secretary of State

KAR 7-47-2, procedural audits.

The Committee suggests that data compiled during the procedural audits be provided in an annual report to the Legislature's committees hearing election-related bills, which currently include the House Committee on Elections and the Senate Committee on Federal and State Affairs.

Kansas Corporation Commission

Request. The Committee requests that the agency coordinate with the Kansas Highway Patrol to provide statistics concerning the number of citations issued to both individuals and

companies for a driver's noncompliance with the North American Standard Out-of-Service Criteria under both the 2024 Criteria previously in effect and the 2026 Criteria.

Kansas Department of Health and Environment

Representative Corbet suggests that a landowner not be required to purchase a night-vision coyote hunting permit if a landowner is hunting in this manner on only the landowner's land.

The Committee encourages the Commission to consider, in an effort to combat underage gambling and fraud, looking at consumer protection issues as those issues arise in the industry, and requiring each sports wagering platform to utilize know-your-customer websites that require photo verification, such as passive verification or active liveness verification, when a user creates a new sports wagering account or when a user places a wager.
